LinkedIn is a professional social media platform with 400 million users worldwide.

- Have a complete LinkedIn profile & a professional photo
 - Your profile will be similar to your CV. First impressions count! Write your profile in Word first and when it is error free copy it into LinkedIn.
 - o Use positive verbs and include your achievements, both academic and work related.
 - o Include paid and unpaid roles and if appropriate, a link to your portfolio/show reel or blog.

- Research people who have completed a similar degree course
 - Use the Advanced tab to carry out a People search to find others with a similar degree.
 - Look at their profiles. Find out how they started their careers and what groups they have joined.
- Develop your network join groups and take part in discussions
 - o If you want to find good groups to join, look at the groups people in your professional area have joined. Take a look at the members of the groups you are part of already. Scroll to the end of the profile of any person in that group and see what other groups they have joined.
