

OUR FLEXIBLE POST-16 TRANSITION WORKSHOPS GIVE YOUR STUDENTS THE INFORMATION THEY NEED TO MAKE AN INFORMED DECISION ABOUT THEIR OPTIONS AFTER FURTHER EDUCATION.

Applying through UCAS

Students explore the application process including when and how to apply, choices, deadlines, responding to offers, Extra and Clearing.

Apprenticeships

Students are introduced to apprenticeships; what they are, how they work and how to apply.

Choosing a course and university

Looking at the range of higher education institutions and courses available, students are challenged to think about the most important factors when choosing a subject and university.

Interview skills

Outlining practical steps to prepare for university or job interviews, we demonstrate how to give evidence of skills and experience. This session can be tailored to students interested in health and social care courses.

Introduction to higher education

What do students need to consider when thinking about going to university? Students explore:

- > how to research universities and courses
- > the application process
- > the benefits and value of higher education.

Introduction to Teesside University

Students discover what it's like to study at Teesside University. We take a look at courses, accommodation, facilities, student support, Students' Union and living in the region.

Personal branding

Students consider the successes of famous brands and their strengths and qualities, exploring their online presence and how this can be used to pitch themselves to universities and potential employers.

Presentation skills

We offer advice and guidance on all aspects of delivering presentations as well outlining the importance of non-verbal communication and body language when delivering a message.

Revision skills

Students consider what type of learner they are and how this affects the way they revise. They are introduced to some simple techniques for managing their time and how to develop a balanced approach to study and social life. We also provide hints and tips for relaxation and handling stress.

Student finance and funding

We detail the funding available to support with tuition fees and living costs, and how students pay this back on completion of their studies.

Student life

Students hear first-hand from one of our student ambassadors about what it's like to study at Teesside University. This is an informal opportunity for students to ask questions about higher education and think about what student life is really like.

Discover aerospace and mechanical engineering

Students investigate the properties of a range of materials used in the manufacture of high-speed vehicles. They also have the opportunity to experience our flight simulator.

- Discover chemical and process engineering We explore the design and operation of different chemical unit operations, from simple heat exchangers to complex distillation columns. Students also get the opportunity to experience our very own distillation column.
- Discover civil engineering and construction management

Using interactive software, we explore the design and construction of a simple bridge and carry out experiments to investigate stresses and bending across the beams.

Discover energy engineering How does renewable energy like solar and wind generate enough electricity for us? Students look at engineering through a sustainability lens, and

at engineering through a sustainability lens, and work in groups to design, make and use renewable energy devices.

> Discover electrical, electronic, instrumentation and control engineering

Students experiment with electricity generation using solar PV systems. They learn how to measure current and voltage and then calculate power output. We investigate the impact of daily and seasonal changes in radiation on energy output.
