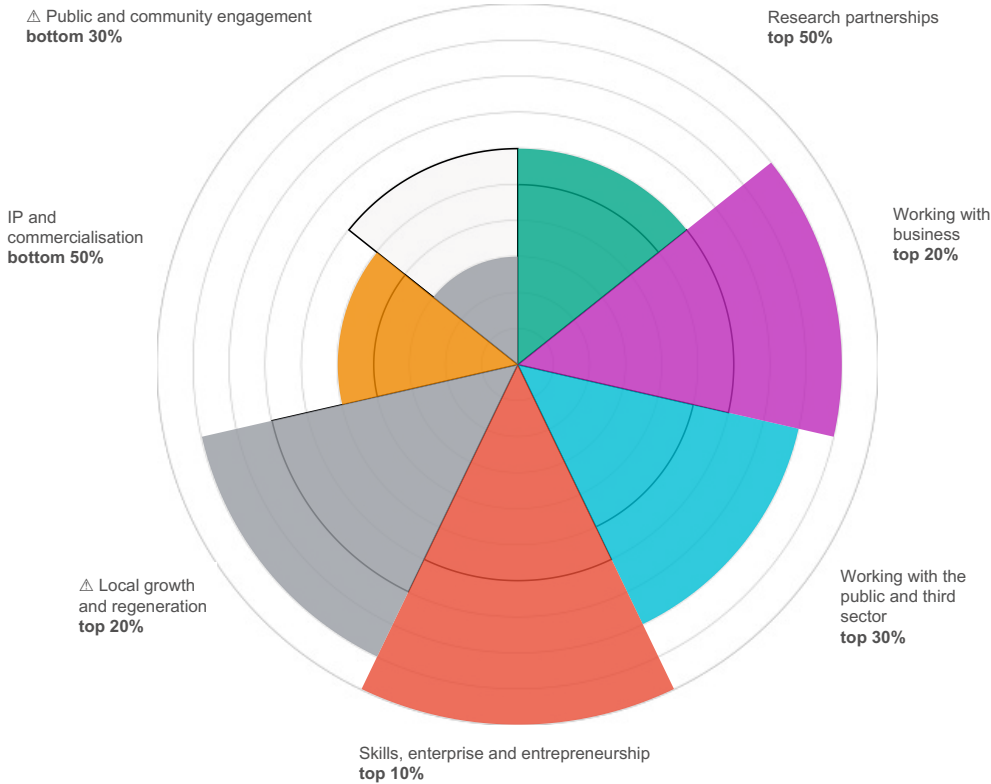


Institution Teesside University

Each segment below shows the relative strength of the selected institution for each KEF perspective, compared against the average for the cluster they are a member of (as denoted by black decile line). Segments are displayed using deciles; for example, a segment that reaches the outer edge of the chart shows that the selected institution is one of the top 10% of all institutions for that perspective.



**Institution Context**

Teesside University, based in Middlesbrough in the Tees Valley, serves some 19,500 full- and part-time students, of whom over 70% come from within the North East. Research is driven by multidisciplinary Grand Challenges (Vibrant, Cohesive and Resilient Societies, Green Economy; and Healthcare and Wellbeing), supporting research centres with a strong focus on industrial and public sector collaboration. From its origins in 1930, the University has sustained a strong business mission and a commitment to the wellbeing and economic growth of its region, characterised by partnerships with schools, FE, business and health organisations, and the local Combined Authority. Significant growth in international student numbers underpins its ambition to be an academically excellent international university at the heart of the Tees Valley.

**Cluster J summary**

Mid-sized universities with more of a teaching focus (although research is still in evidence). Academic activity across STEM and non-STEM disciplines including other health, computer sciences, architecture/planning, social sciences and business, humanities, arts and design. Research activity funded largely by government bodies/hospitals; 13.7% from industry.
