Privacy Notice for Department for International Development

1. Purpose of this Notice

Teesside University

This Privacy Notice tells you how Teesside University as Data Controller, collects and processes your personal data as administrator of the 2024 GREAT Scholarship in partnership with the British Council.

We may amend this notice to reflect changes to our website, business, data protection law or other legislation. For this reason, we ask that you revisit this notice on a regular basis.

2. Why your Personal Data is Collected

Your Personal Data is collected in order to help the University to adminster the elgiblity of international live offer holders with regard to the GREAT British Council Scholarship 2024.

3. How Personal Data is Collected

Personal Data is collected from you at application stage via the University's application form. Once a successful Scholar is identified by the International Scholarship Committee, their details are shared with the British Council (see 5.1).

The University will only share your Personal Data with external third parties where we are permitted to do so under Data Protection Legislation.

Where we have a lawful basis, we may pass Personal Data to third parties in the following circumstances:

5.1 **The British Council** – this will be required so the British Council can contact successful Scholars about pre-departure briefings, conduct programme reporting, evaluation and promotion of future programmes.

6. Lawful Basis

The University processes this personal data in line with the requirements of the British Council and in accordance with its public task to enable access and participation to higher education.

7. Transfers of Personal Data outside of the EEA

International processing is not envisaged within this activity but in the event that it is necessary to transfer data outside the EEA this is done pursuant to an agreement which ensures that necessary safeguards are in place.

8. Security of Personal Data

We take technical and organisational measures to protect all of the Personal Data we hold. Only authorised employees and contractors have access to your Personal Data.

9. Personal Data Retention Periods

We will only retain the Personal Data we hold about you as long as necessary and in accordance with the University's Retention Policy.

10. Your Responsibilities

GDPR requires that Personal Data is accurate. It is essential that you let the University know if any information you have provided changes. If you fail to

update your details, the University cannot take responsibility if any information you require is sent to the wrong address or shared with relevant parties.

11. Your Rights

Teesside University

As a data subject you have certain rights:

Right to complain You have the right to lodge a complaint with the Information Commissioner's Office details are provided below;

Right to access personal data: You can find out what information we hold about you by making a subject access request. The request can be made free of charge, by writing to the Data Protection Officer, details of which are below.

Right to Erasure (Right to be Forgotten) You have the right to have the Personal Data we hold about you erased;

Right to object You have the right to object at any time to the processing of your Personal Data;

Right to withdraw Consent Where consent forms are the basis for processing, you have the right to withdraw your consent to the processing at any time;

Right to Data Portability If you request us to we will transmit your Personal Data directly to another organisation;

Right to Rectification You have the right to ask us to rectify inaccurate information held about you without undue delay.

These are not unqualified rights and the University may not be able to act on your request in certain circumstances.
